Abstract submissions

The countdown is on!

This is a reminder that abstract submissions for the 3rd International Conference on UV and Skin Cancer Prevention are closing on *30th May 2015*. We invite you to submit an abstract suitable for an oral, rapid fire or electronic poster presentation.

Abstract submissions can be uploaded at the conference website at http://uvandskincancer2015.org/.

- Click on the black 'Submit abstract' button at the bottom left of the <u>Conference website home</u> <u>page</u>.
- Click on the orange link where it states "All abstracts must be submitted online via e-

Organiser."

- Create a log-in by clicking on the purple bar titled 'Create an author account'.
- 4. Complete contact details.
- A confirmation email will be sent to your nominated email address.
- Click on the email link to 'Proceed to log-in' to activate your account.
- 7. Re-enter your email and password to log-in.
- Go to the purple 'submit abstract' button to complete abstract and submit.

Here are some suggested guidelines to help structure your abstract.

- Introduction: A brief summary of background and a sentence indicating the purpose of the study/program.
- Methods: A brief statement of methods/strategies of the study/program.
- Outcomes: A brief summary of the findings/outcomes of the study/program.
- Relevance: How will these findings/outcomes contribute to the future of UV and skin cancer prevention?
